Volunteers place a new sill log at the end of the Fouts Way Station during restoration. All four sill logs needed to be removed, and these old lock timbers worked very well as replacements.



Clay Sledd chips away at the sawed side of an old timber to make it look more like an ax had been used to cut it. This side will be seen from the inside of the log house.



One by one, replacement timbers are replaced from the bottom up as the corners are jacked apart to relieve the resting tension. One at a time, the bad logs are replaced all around the four sides.



Last week, the Bill Fouts family came to inspect our ongoing restoration work. Bill spearheaded the challenge to get the structure moved from France Park to Canal Park. Originally the Noah Fouts house had been in Deer Creek Township, Cass County. Now it sets in Deer Creek Township, Carroll County.
