#### **Gray Bridge Will Soon Come To Life**



These freshly painted massive parts are ready to be erected into their original form. Then it will be known as the Gray Bridge. It will span from one side of the Canal to other, near where the Bike Shop is located in Canal Park (background far right). Serving as a foot bridge, it will ultimately connect trails in Canal Park to downtown via the City's planned Gateway Trail.
